Finding out which items are where

There are a number of library catalogues which contain details from groups of libraries. It is always a good idea to double check the catalogue of the library you wish to visit before making a special trip.

InforM25 Union List of Serials www.inform25.ac.uk/ULS/

This holds details of all of the journals held by the University of London libraries, Imperial College Library and the University of Westminster library.

Senate House Library

Senate House Library is the main University of London library and is particularly useful for information in the social sciences. All LSHTM staff and students can become full members of Senate House Library, complete an application form available from LSHTM and ensure it is verified by LSHTM Library staff. Then take the form, plus your School ID to the Senate House Library Membership Desk.

Senate House Library allows electronic access to all of its databases and e-journals to all library members. However, you must use the links in the Senate House Library catalogue to access them. When prompted enter your name and your library barcode number. You can find out more about Senate House Library on their website at: www.ull.ac.uk.



Other University of London Libraries

A list of all of the colleges and institutes which constitute the University of London can be found online at: www.london.ac.uk/colleges_institutes.html. They have agreed to allow access to their libraries to any student from any of the University of London institutions – just show your LSHTM pass. This agreement is only in place for printed material. Please check the individual college's library website for details of opening hours and access arrangements.

Other academic libraries: Sconul Access www.access.sconul.ac.uk

LSHTM participates in a scheme called Sconul Access which allows LSHTM students to have borrowing rights in a number of other libraries. Which libraries you get access to and the services you can use depend on who you are and which library you wish to visit. Check the SCONUL Access website for further details.

Before you visit a library you must obtain a SCONUL Access card from the LSHTM Library Enquiries Desk. Take this, with your LSHTM pass to the library you would like to visit. They will then give you a card to access their library. In most cases, this does NOT include access to electronic resources.

The British Library www.bl.uk

The British Library, situated on Euston Road, is the UK National Library. All LSHTM staff and students are eligible for a reader ticket, just take your LSHTM pass, proof of your home address and something with your signature.
