

Overview


At LSHTM there were 261 respondents to PTES 2020. The overall satisfaction they had with their studies was 91%, this was 12% higher than the score for the sector.

92% of students stated there were opportunities to give feedback on their own experience, 16% above the sector. Less positively, relative to the benchmark, just 62% of respondents stated feedback on their work was prompt.





Areas of experience by quarters

The graph below shows the position of LSHTM in relation to institutions in the sector benchmark. LSHTM was mostly in the highest quarter.





Difference by areas of experience

The area respondents at LSHTM were most positive about was Teaching, which was 9% above the sector. The area students were least positive about was Assessment, which was around the same as the sector.


























Overall satisfaction

Focus on: 31 years old or older


For respondents who were 31 years old or older, the overall satisfaction they had with their studies was 86%, based on 78 responses. This was 4% higher than the score in this group for the sector.

96% of students stated they had developed their research skills, 14% above the sector. In contrast, just 65% of respondents stated feedback on their work was prompt, 9% below the sector score for this group.



Focus on: Mode - Part-time

The overall satisfaction respondents who were part-time had with their studies was 80%, based on 15 responses. This was 3% lower than the score in this group for the sector.

All (100%) students stated their supervisor provided helpful feedback, 25% above the sector. Less positively, relative to the benchmark, just 40% of respondents stated the timetable fit well with their commitments, 38% below the sector score for this group.







Student profile comparison

This page shows how the demographic profile of students responding to the survey studying at LSHTM compares with the sector. Within discipline, the discipline which has the greatest difference between LSHTM and the sector is Subjects allied to medicine, with LSHTM having 60% more students studying within this discipline.

PTES 2020: LSHTM and the Sector

The Postgraduate Taught Experience Survey

PTES is the leading survey of Taught Postgraduates in the UK, with 41,185 respondents in 2020, achieving a 19.6% response rate. 69 institutions were involved in the survey.

Quarter methodology

The quarters are based on all institutions that have, on average, 23 valid responses or over to the questions making up the survey area. Quarters are only reported when there are a minimum of 8 institutions within an area.
