Under an Order of The High Court of Justice, Chancery Division, dated the 24th March 1925 the Trustees were directed to pay to me this deponent the sum of £488 a year for the maintenance of the Patient payable quarterly on the 24th February, 24th May, 24th August, and 24th November in each year. The last quarterly payment was made on the 24th May 1934. The cost of the maintenance of the Patient is at present in excess of her income but I have paid the balance myself.
