For some time she was at The Cassel Home, <sup>lands</sup> Swayford, Sussex but as her health did not appear to be improving she was placed under the care of a Nurse residing with the family and was subsequently sent

to Dr. Crouch at St. Michaels, Ascot on 31st March 1934. The expenses there have averaged £39 a fortnight, but it is proposed that she should have

a less expensive room which will be within her income. If she does not show signs of improving, ~~in the near future~~ it is proposed that subject to
