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Follow up Assessment

- When?
- Forms to complete
 - Follow up assessment
 - EESS
 - Laboratory tests
- Adverse Events
- What we need to remember



Follow up Assessment

- All assessments after the first visit
- Follow up visit
- Quality of life questionnaires (DLQI and SF-36) in specific visits on the 24^{th,} 48th and 60th weeks
- Important to take note
 - Medication in use
 - EESS
 - New symptoms
 - Physical examination
 - Laboratory tests
 - Adverse Event

Follow up Assessment

- Ask how the participant feels compared to last visit
- ASK AND TAKE NOTES OF COMPLAINS
- If you want to report a adverse event fills it the adverse event form
- VERIFY THE RANDOMISATION NUMBER and MEDICATION PACKAGE NUMBER
- Prescribe the additional medication needed
- Check the next appointment and write it down on the participant card
- Ask the participant if he/she have any question
- Send the participant to the pharmacist

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Summary

- Ask for signs and symptoms
- Physical examination
- EESS
- medication in use
- Laboratory tests
- DLQI and SF-36 on the 24/48/60 weeks
- Verify randomisation number
- Prescribe medication needed
- Schedule follow up appointment
- Send to the pharmacist
