
# NIHR Associate Principle Investigator scheme

The Associate PI (API) scheme aims to develop doctors, nurses and allied health professionals who do not undertake research as part of their usual role, to help them become PIs of the future while helping to deliver studies to time and target.

CHIP-BCIS3 is an API registered study and we encourage all PIs to support junior colleagues to take on a new role. API status is endorsed by the NIHR and Royal Colleges.

The 6 month scheme could play an important role in recruitment as it formally recognises the significant contribution of the associate PI to the conduct and delivery of the trial which will includes (among other things) patient recruitment, trial advocacy to their peers, and increasing awareness both within and out of hours.

Below, Dr Krishnaraj Rathod tells us about his experience as an Associate PI at St. Bartholomew's Hospital, London.
