The IHCoR-Africa newsletter will be produced thrice a year with the aim of informing members, partners and collaborators about activities, events and progress on the project. It will also be used to disseminate findings and new developments in the field of hypertension in rural Africa.

What is IHCoR-Africa?

The Improving Hypertension Control in Rural Sub-Saharan Africa (IHCOR-Africa) National Institute for Health and Care Research (NIHR) Group is a collaboration between the KEMRI-Wellcome Trust Research Programme (KWTRP) in Kenya, the Medical Research Council Unit at The Gambia (MRCG), and the London School of Hygiene & Tropical Medicine (LSHTM) in the UK, that aims to strengthen research and improve hypertension management in sub-Saharan Africa.

Its objectives are:

- Understand the experiences, needs, and practices at the individual, organisational and system levels to detect, treat and control hypertension;
- Determine the optimal diagnostic and risk stratification approaches for people with hypertension; and,
- Develop and evaluate the feasibility of a community-centred programme to improve the management of hypertension.

The group is led by two co-principal investigators Pablo Perel (LSHTM) and Anthony Etyang (KWTRP) shown below from right to left.





Training

IHCoR-Africa Online Training

IHCOR-Africa group will be offering a portfolio of training in collaboration with the Initiative to Develop African Research Leaders (<u>IDeAL</u>), the Pan African Society of Cardiology (<u>PASCAR</u>), the Kenyan Cardiac Society (<u>KCS</u>), and Science for Africa Foundation (<u>SFA Foundation</u>). As part of this portfolio of training, the team has offered the first of these courses entitled, "Introduction to hypertension research".

The course that ran from 15 March to 5 April covered the following topics:

- Setting the scene of hypertension in sub-Saharan Africa
- An introduction to the epidemiology of hypertension
- An introduction to health systems factors in hypertension management
- An introduction to clinical trials for hypertension research

The course brought together 60 participants from the following 15 countries in Sub-Saharan - Cameroon, Gambia, Ghana, Kenya, Malawi, Mauritius, Mozambique, Nigeria, Senegal, Sierra Leone, South Africa, Tanzania Uganda, Zambia, and Zimbabwe.

The next course, running in June, will cover the basics of study design for hypertension research, bias, and confounding interpreting data and critically appraising literature.

Research Leadership and Grant Writing Workshop



IHCOR-Africa organized a training workshop on research leadership and grant writing for early career researchers who are working on hypertension and related chronic diseases in Sub-Saharan Africa. The workshop, held in The Gambia, provided experience and skills required for professional and personal career development in health research.

Participants included post-doctoral fellows, mid-level clinical researchers and PhD students from 12 countries — Cameroon, DRC, Ethiopia, Gambia, Ghana, Kenya, Malawi, Nigeria, Senegal, Tanzania, Uganda, and UK. 11 male, 7 female.
