



Post Description: Antimicrobial Resistance Centre Student Liaison Officers (MSc Student)

Centre background: The Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR) Centre aims to help improve and support antimicrobial resistance research at LSHTM and worldwide.

Its objectives are to:

- Promote and facilitate high quality research into AMR that builds on and exploits disciplinary strengths across LSHTM.
- Facilitate AMR related funding responses and collaboration opportunities.
- Provide an interface for LSHTM's AMR research for staff, public, press and wider research communities.
- Provide educational materials on AMR.

The Centre of Antimicrobial Resistance is organised around five key pillars, which are described in greater detail on the [Centre's website](#):

1. Biological and Pharmacological Sciences
2. Clinical and Veterinary Sciences
3. Humanities and Environmental Sciences
4. Epidemiology and Modelling
5. Economic, Social and Political Sciences

Why become an SLO?

- Enhanced access and networking opportunities within all levels of LSHTM.
- Build on skill sets which will improve employability.
- In-depth understanding of topic area outside of the curriculum.
- Shape outputs within the Centre to the student body, wider School community and external audiences.

Purpose of role:

Up to three student liaison officers will work closely with the AMR Centre student representatives in order to strengthen engagement of students with the AMR Centre. This voluntary role is intended for students to engage with the centre, provide communications support to the student representatives and promote the activities and events to the student body.



Key responsibilities:

- **Coordination and communications support**
 - Connect and coordinate the MSc student body with the AMR Centre, and set up and maintain communications to connect MSc students interested in AMR with each other.
 - Collaborate for action – the SLOs will work together with the Student Representative to establish priorities for AMR communications, activities and events that can be led by and be oriented towards the LSHTM student body. The SLOs will be encouraged to check-in with the Student Representative to gain advice and support on achieving their plans.
 - Produce materials – the SLOs work alongside Centre Communications Officers to prepare materials such as newsletter content and website blogs, profiling the interests and perspectives of the LSHTM student body.
 - Cross-Centre ecosystem – when relevant, work with other centres on student-based projects, whether this is events or communications.
- **Event planning and support**
 - Work with the Student Representative, Communications Officer and central events team to formulate ideas and organise the logistical aspects of events. This presents an opportunity to engage external organisations in AMR.
